

2017 EULAR / ACR Exchange programme

San Diego, California, from 3 - 8 November 2017 (including mandatory additional day for site visit and half day workshop)

Detailed application requirements:

During the application process each applicant will be asked to fill in / upload:

- A **personal statement** outlining how participation in the 2017 EULAR/ACR program will benefit their research career and how they can contribute to the program (fill in directly).
- Current **curriculum vitae** (PDF format - please include publications in your CV).
This document should include:
 - **Summary of teaching activities** undertaken as a rheumatologist and **mentoring/supervision activities** (e.g. medical student projects, other PhD students, educational supervision (incl. date of activity), if applicable
 - Your publications
- Letter of recommendation from a senior academician within rheumatology, as PDF
- Letter of support from Chief of Rheumatology, as PDF
These 2 letters need to be combined and uploaded as **one** PDF document.

NOTE: Please have all documents prepared before the application process is started.

Deadline to submit your application is 14 February 2017

Only complete applications submitted online through the EULAR website will be considered. It is the applicant's responsibility to review the application for completeness and errors, and to ensure that it adheres to all posted instructions. Applicants are responsible for submitting all required sections and documents prior to the deadline noted on this application.

Applicant compliance agreement:

Applicants agree to comply with the EULAR/ACR reporting requirements, including an experience report to be sent to EULAR after completion of the exchange.

Applicants agree to participate in the 2017 EULAR/ACR Exchange Programme that will take place in San Diego, California, from 3 - 8 November 2017 (including a mandatory institution visit and half day workshop). They certify to be in possession of a passport valid for these dates and extending beyond the return date as required by the US government and their own country.

Applicants understand that they are responsible for all costs over and above the travel stipend provided as well as any costs related to spouse travel, accommodations, and incidentals.
